Board Reports

Vice President's News from "Community Relations and Ordinance Education" – Doug Wickstrom

RHE City News:

City-sponsored programs are beginning to return after the restrictions during the past year. Soon to launch will be an Earth Day celebration on April 17 with a Drive-In Movie Night at Howlett Park featuring the Disney movie "Wall-E." Tickets are required and are available on the RHE City website starting April 2.

The remaining special events anticipated for this summer include the Mayor's Breakfast Ride in May and the Palos Verdes Chamber of Commerce's Street Fair and Music Festival in June.

The City reports that municipal tennis courts at Ernie Howlett Park are open for limited play. There are restrictions relating to physical distancing, doubles playing only, and a few other issues. Details are available on the RHE City website.

For Rollingwood residents driving eastbound on Palos Verdes Drive North, the City reports that construction will impact traffic on PVDN between Crenshaw Blvd. and PVD East through March. This project relates to installing a 2" conduit for future fiber optic networking and 5G wireless technology. Southern California Edison will also be working on electrical infrastructure for this project. Work is expected to be completed by the end of March.

Development Projects near Hawthorne Blvd. at Via Valmonte:

As mentioned in previous newsletters, the RHOA is monitoring the activity on both of the following projects due to their potential impact on traffic flow along Hawthorne Blvd. at the intersection with Via Valmonte. 24601 Hawthorne Blvd. Residential Project An 11 unit residential project (plus 3,000 sq. ft. of commercial space) is working its way through the City of Torrance Planning Department. An "environmental assessment" is expected to be released for public review and comment in the next few weeks. After a 30 day comment period, the project will be presented to the Torrance Planning Commission for approval. Due to the probable adverse impact of this project on traffic flow at the intersection of Hawthorne and Via Valmonte, the RHOA plans to submit a comment letter to the City of Torrance during the official comment period. The City of RHE says that it will likely submit a comment letter as well.

Butcher/Solana Project

The proposed 248 unit Butcher/Solana Real Estate Development in the City of Torrance (also near the intersection of Via Valmonte and Hawthorne Blvd.) remains in "limbo" according to the City of Torrance Planning Department. Torrance has suspended its planning review of this large residential project, pending further steps by the developer.

Community Appearance – Warren Arata

City address Rollingwood neighborhood sidewalks.

Our Board's efforts to get the City/ County of Los Angeles to address some of our sidewalk issues has finally come to fruition. The worst sidewalk areas on Rockbluff, Silver Eagle, and Broken Bow have been repaired. Not only were sidewalks repaired, but in some cases, entire driveway aprons were re-poured. If you have walked lately on these three streets, you would have noticed that the sidewalks, as a whole, are in much better shape and easily navigable even in the dark. Rollingwood will need to wait until January 2022 for further repairs to our neighborhood because of budget constraints. It's a slow process, and the City and County's ability to finance this year's repairs was undoubtedly hindered by the national health crisis we are experiencing.

About 20 trees needed to be removed either due to roots impacting repair work or the tree's condition. The City

has an unofficial policy to replace trees that are removed but is still determining appropriate species of trees to install. We hope to hear back from the City in the next few weeks on their decision.

The Board still has a list of spots in Rollingwood where sidewalks are a problem. If you have noticed one on any walks you may have taken, please let us know. We will confirm on our master list that we forward to the City/ County for review. You can let the Board know by going to the Rollingwood HOA newsletter and contact Warren Arata.

Current status of unkempt homes.

We are just about to enter Spring. The warming of the days will spur trees and shrubs to awaken from their winter respite. Unfortunately, weeds are on the same path. Neighborhood pedestrians noted a few homes with front yards that needed quite a bit of TLC, and with the help of the City, we were able to have the City address a few of the homes and got a favorable response from owners.

With the warmer weather will come more neighborhood walkers and more eyes on the street. If you notice any front yards that seem to be less than ideal due to neglect, you can contact our Rollingwood HOA. We will forward the concern to the City for action.

There have been many coyote sightings in Rollingwood and throughout the City. Please be aware.

Coyote Reminder Feding coyotes is prohibited. Do not leave small children or pets outside unattended. Remove water and food sources from yard areas - including allen fruit. Discourage a coyote's approach by "hazing" - yell loudly, waiving arms to make yourself large. Report: RtE.city/coyote (310) 377-1577 Emergencies Dial 9-1-1

Preventing human-coyote conflict in your neighborhood

- Feeding coyotes is prohibited and subject to penalty fines.
- Do not leave small children or pets outside unattended.
- Trim ground-level shrubbery to reduce hiding places.
- Remove sources of water and fallen fruit from yard areas.
- Keep trash & compost lids closed at all times.
- Secure doggie doors and limit usage.
- Discourage a coyote's approach by "hazing" yell loudly, wave your arms to make yourself large, stomp your feet, and throw projectiles at it.
- Ask your neighbors to follow these precautions.

Remember:

- NEVER run away from a coyote!
- If the coyote doesn't leave at first, increase the intensity of your hazing
- Continue hazing until the coyote completely leaves the area.
- Call 911 for emergencies/Report to City
