TREASURER'S REPORT (Kathy Walker)

The RHE code compliance officer, Susan Matthews, investigated an unkempt yard on Rockbluff.

The board took an action to look for candidates for the Beautification Award.

Note: When remodelling or upgrading an electrical panel, RHE requires you route power to your house underground. The only exceptions: hardship (can't afford the cost) or your neighbor's refusal to grant easement if the power must cross their property.

MEMBERSHIP: Juanita Stucker

The only activity in the neighborhood so far is one new lease. Juanita will visit them this week.

NEWSLETTER: Jim Knauf

The newsletter has been posted on the website.

PRESIDENT: Judy Bayer

Action: Richard: Check on PVE Neighborhood Watch. The question came up about license plate cameras for the entrance: <u>flocksafety.com</u> currently offers them for \$2500/camera/year (after \$350 for installation). We would need at least two (one for Willow Wood, one for Kingspine, and ideally two at each location - coming and going.)

We don't have the annual income to support even the recurring cost for a camera at each entrance, let alone our other annual expenses.

The next meeting will be May 19, 2022 at 7 PM, held by Zoom.

Judy is planning a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new playground equipment - we're expecting this in August or September. Judy is looking for someone to organize this - Juanita suggested Kathy Swank.

For any followup on unkempt yards, the feeling of the board is that a letter should be sent to the property owner notifying them of the condition.
