RHE City News Rockbluff Park Playground Equipment

Rockbluff Park is one and a half acres of beautiful parkland located at the end of Rockbluff Drive. With involvement of a neighborhood subcommittee, in spring, the City sent out a survey to the Rollingwood neighborhood seeking input on the future playground equipment to replace the outdated set at Rockbluff Park.



With nearly 70 responses, the input received helped finetune features proposed. The play equipment will serve ages 5-12 with a slide, climbing feature, shade and other creative play features.

In addition, the City also proposed a new swing set that will offer a regular swing in addition to single, toddler and accessible swings and a structure with a curving slide and climbing features with shade.





The subcommittee continued to work with City staff and the Parks and Activities Commissioners on finalizing the proposals which were reviewed and approved by the Commission at its meeting of October 20, followed by City Council's review and ultimate approval on December 14th. City staff estimates the project will be completed in about four months.

The RHE City Council acknowledged the succession of Frank Zerunyan to the position of mayor of RHE at the December 14th City Council meeting. Frank succeeds Steve Zuckerman who has served several terms as mayor during his many years of service to the City. Both Frank and Steve have been strong supporters of the Rollingwood community over the years.

Captain James Powers, commander of the Lomita Station of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, gave a presentation during the December 14th RHE City Council meeting. He said that the number of patrol units in the City was increased starting in November, 2021. That explains the increased visibility of sheriff's cars in our neighborhood over the past few months.

Also, Cpt. Powers reported that overall crime statistics for RHE, year-to-date, have decreased 21% versus 2020. The only significant increase was in auto thefts which doubled from 3 reported thefts to 6 reported thefts this year. Cpt. Powers reminded residents to lock their cars and keep valuables out of sight in their vehicles. He also recommended that we participate in the **Neighborhood Watch** program and report any unusual incidents to the Lomita station of the Sheriff's department at (310) 539-1661.

Waste Management Residential Organics Program.

Waste Management now has its organic waste collection service in operation. Food scraps (Produce, Meat, Dairy, Bakery, and Food-Soiled Paper) must be placed in a separate paper bag in the "WM Green Organics Cart" along with the usual grass clippings and yard trimmings. WM recommends collecting the food scraps (listed above), in the light green plastic basket that was delivered to RHE homes in October and November. The food scraps should then be placed in PAPER bags and deposited in the green-colored yard waste collection cart. Plastic, glass, metal, and waxed paper are NOT acceptable for the green cart. The organic waste-filled paper bags should now be included along with other green yard waste and not placed in the gray, general trash container. A reminder: dogs are welcome on City trails, in open spaces, and in City Parks but must remain on leash and under full control of the owner. This rule is according to both City of RHE and L.A. County Codes. **Covid-19 statistics for the City of RHE:** For RHE residents, 92.4% have been vaccinated through December 16, 2021. As of December 21, there have been 479 Covid-19 cases in RHE and 8 deaths.

Residential and Commercial Projects on Hawthorne Blvd. at Via Valmonte:

The City of Torrance Planning Department reports that the two residential/commercial projects located at the intersection of Via Valmonte and Hawthorne Blvd. have become inactive for the immediate future. As mentioned previously, the RHOA is monitoring the activity on both of the following projects due to their potential impact on traffic flow along Hawthorne Blvd. at the intersection with Via Valmonte. The projects in question include:

The 24601 Hawthorne Blvd. Mixed Use Residential and Commercial Project and The 248 unit Butcher/Solana Real Estate Development

The Torrance Planning Department has suspended action on both mixed-use projects pending further steps by the developers.

Trash Barrels Reminder: Put out late Tuesday afternoon or Wednesday morning and bring in by Wednesday evening. Do not store in your front yard in view from the street.

RHE Municipal Code: Chapter 8.20 – INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT 8.20.080 - Use and placement of containers and bulky items.

B. Time of Placement. No person may place a container adjacent to a street or public right-of-way before 4:00 p.m. on the day before the regularly scheduled collection day, nor may any person place any bulky items adjacent to a street or public right-of-way before 4:00 p.m. on the day before the collection day set by the solid waste collector. All containers or bulky items must be placed in a proper collection location by 6:30 a.m. on the day of collection.

D. Return to Storage Location. After the collection of solid waste, each container must be promptly removed by no later than 8:00 p.m. on the regular collection day and returned to a location on the lot where the container cannot be viewed from the street.

Update on the Kingspine entry landscaping

This has been a tough time to get landscaping done. Now that we are looking at another spike in Corona Virus, most companies are even more understaffed. We Winter Rains. Since the last update, the year prior, we had seen a few homes address issues with unkempt yards. Overall, since last year we have seen an improvement community-wide. The heavy rainfall a few weeks ago was a mixed blessing. We got much-needed precipitation, but it all came at once and created a few problems with runoff. There are areas where soil and rock have washed over sidewalks. Please look to see that the sidewalks in front of your homes are clear and safe for pedestrians. The great weather we have had has brought out the neighborhood walkers. With all the moisture, we will soon get a new crop of weeds. They are actively growing now and will soon be sending out seed heads. If you can get out there and look to knock down the weeds before they go to seed, we can slowly eliminate them. Letting them go to seed will lay the ground with seeds for next year.

We have had a big storm that brought a lot of water to our area, but we are by no means out of the woods. The Sierra Nevada now has 51% of the normal snowpack. We are still in the throes of a years-long drought. With our current drought status, California has proclaimed a state of emergency and has stated that the "... Water Board may adopt emergency regulations, as it deems necessary, to supplement voluntary conservation by prohibiting wasteful water practices. It doesn't seem like the time to talk about fire prevention, but with all of the new moisture we have received, we will get a new crop of weeds and shrub growth on slopes and areas that are not actively managed. It's not hard to remember last summer and all of the fires we had in California alone. Drought Prohibited Uses of Water

Although the recent rains helped, we are still in a drought.

Cal Water wants to ensure our customers are aware of the following prohibited uses of potable water:

- Applying water to outdoor landscapes that causes runoff onto adjacent property, nonirrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots, or structures
- Using a hose to wash motor vehicles unless the hose is fitted with a shutoff nozzle or device that causes it to cease dispensing water immediately when not in use
- Applying water to driveways and sidewalks
- Using water in a water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system
- Applying water to outdoor landscapes during and within 48 hours after measurable rainfall (0.25 inches)
- Irrigating outside of new construction without drip or microspray systems
- Irrigating landscape between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.
