On April 19th, Rollingwood HOA held a 'Let's Chat'. The event was hosted by Mark and Lisa Pope who graciously opened their home for the event. We had a great turnout, and a lot of important information was passed around. Jessica Slawson, Management Analyst from the City Manager's office was there representing RHE and fielded questions about City vs homeowner responsibilities pertaining to many of the open space areas within and surrounding our community. Interim Chief Brian Kane and Community Services Liaison Rosemary Vivero from the Los Angeles County Fire department presented information on the LACFD

inspection process, and the process by which violators will be notified and fined if violations are not corrected. They also discussed SCE's role in reducing fire fuel within their easements. The subject of evacuation vs shelter in place also was discussed. Deputy Foresters Delos Reyes and Wen Wang represented LACFD Forestry Division and highlighted how LACFD looks at defensible space in Los Angeles County's wildland-urban interface.

All together it was a great presentation with several opinions, good and bad, about our current situation. More of our residents are attending our Let's Chat presentations. With the increased attendance comes more and varied opinions from the neighborhood which bring to light many nuances and issues others may not know about. It's also a great opportunity to meet others from the neighborhood.

As RHE continues its partnership with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and neighboring cities to prioritize public safety, we all appreciate our community working to protect themselves, their families, and each other. News from Community Relations and Ordinance Education Doug Wickstrom, Vice President.

Update on Recent SCE Power Outage:

On April 4, 2024 there was a power outage in a large section of Rollingwood that lasted several hours. The Southern California Edison Company reports that the outage resulted from a fallen tree branch that shut down one of the Edison power lines until repairs were completed.

We also asked the Edison Company to review the seemingly frequent power failures in Rollingwood versus other sections of PV and also for an update on the power system upgrade that was planned for the Rollingwood and adjoining areas.

Preparations for Emergencies (Let's Chat):

At the close of the informative RHOA "Let's Chat" meeting held on Friday, April 19th, LA County Fire Department representatives provided several interesting handouts. Topics included establishing and maintaining a 'Defensible Space' between a home or other structure and nearby plants, brush, and trees. An informative guide on this topic is available on the L.A. County Fire Department web site: fire.lacounty.gov.

In dealing with family preparations for emergencies, CalFire also provides landscaping tips and ideas on "firescaping" your residence at their website: readyforwildfire.org.

One other important piece of information: the Rollingwood/Marloma area of the Palos Verdes Peninsula, is located in **Evacuation Zone RHE-E008**. Among other helpful ideas, the site provides a list of emergency kit contents and a pre-planning checklist for personal, legal, financial and other important data.

George F. Canyon Nature Center Project Moves Forward

The City reports that contracts for construction of the new 3,300 square foot nature center, located at the intersection of Palos Verdes Drive North and Palos Verdes Drive East, should be awarded in June or July of this year.

The new Nature Center will feature a meeting room/class room and viewing decks to promote the canyon and its trails. The Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy continues to manage the land as well as the new facility which has an estimated cost of almost \$4.0 million.

Crime Report from L.A. County Sheriff's Department Lomita Station

Since late February, there was only one crime reported on the Sheriff's public information system; theft of a package at a residence on Bluemound Road on April 8th.

5323 Ironwood Street (Silver Spur Canyon) Condominium Project

In January, 2024, a real estate developer, under the corporate name of "Verdes Estates, Inc.", submitted a preliminary set of plans to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes for a proposed 641,193 square foot condominium project in RPV. The 4-building complex, each with 7 stories of above ground residential units and 3 stories of below ground parking, would be located in the the empty canyon between Silver Spur Road (on the east) and Birchfield Avenue (on the west) in the City of RPV. The presently undeveloped canyon property is southwest of the Lutheran Church on Silver Spur Road.

The proposed development is of interest and concern to Rollingwood residents because:

• The seven stories of above ground level buildings are likely to impact views from some Rollingwood residences.

• There is a potential negative impact on some Rollingwood home values due to the addition of large, high-density buildings in a single family housing community.

• There is an almost certain adverse impact on traffic for Rollingwood residents using the Kingspine Road and/or Willow Wood Road entrances to Rollingwood.

• There is a potential impact on child school placements (Silver Spur Elementary) due to the 482 new residential units in the RPV canyon.

• Heavy construction vehicle traffic during the construction period will likely impede Rollingwood vehicle flow around PV Drive North and Silver Spur for an extended period of construction.

In addition to the items above, the preliminary plan application (page 4 of the submission to the City of RPV) contains a list of 21 waivers and 3 incentives requested from the City of RPV by the developer. Several of these waivers have a potential adverse impact on Rollingwood residents.

One of the major elements underlying this developer's action relates to Government Code Section 65589.5 (d), known as the "Builder's Remedy." It is a provision of the California Housing Accountability Act that prevents jurisdictions without a substantially compliant housing element from denying certain new housing projects. These projects might proceed even if they don't comply with the local jurisdiction's zoning ordinance or general plan.

Community Appearance Update

...a month into Spring.

We are well into Spring, and it looks like the rainy season has finally ended. With all the rain we had in the past months and now with sunshine and warmth bathing the landscape, we have seen much growth, both wanted and unwanted. It's an opportune time to tackle the removal of all of the weeds and overgrowth around the house – just in time for Los Angeles County's June brush clearance requirements.

Most of the Palos Verdes Peninsula is in a state designated Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone, which means that homeowners are required to maintain defensible space on their property and near structures. The clearing of dry and heavily vegetated areas is a critical wildfire prevention measure.

The brush clearance deadline is June 1, 2024

Most residents will have received an Annual Brush Clearance Notice from the Los Angeles County Fire Department in which requirements and deadlines are outlined. However, all residents are encouraged to keep landscaping maintained and clear of dry or dying brush/vegetation. In doing so, potential fire hazards can be removed or reduced that could lead to the destruction of valuable property or land and lower air quality.

Did you know that choosing the right plants and caring for them properly can make your garden more resistant to wildfires? Fire-smart landscaping aims to provide community members living in wildfire-prone California areas with information on plant species that can withstand flying embers and intense heat. PROHIBITED BICYCLES, <u>E-BIKES</u> AND ALL OTHER VEHICLES ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED ON BRIDLE TRAILS INCLUDING: • STROLLERS • WAGONS • SCHOTERS • MOPEDS Riding bikes can be a quick and fun way to get to around town and to school, especially on some of our city's idyllic, tree-lined streets; however, bicycles, including e-bikes, scooters, mopeds, skateboards, etc. on equestrian trails are strictly prohibited in Rolling Hills Estates.

When riding bicycles, e-bikes,

scooters, etc., be safe by following these simple tips:

• Ride in designated areas (i.e. bike lanes) and in the same direction as traffic and follow traffic signs and signals.

• Always wear a properly fitted helmet and securely fasten the chin strap.

• Never use electronics while riding.



The City of Rolling Hills Estates welcomes dogs along trails, in open spaces, and within parks. However, as a reminder, in order to promote the safety of the animals, the public, trail users, equestrians and their horses and surrounding wildlife, dogs must

remain on their leash under the full control of their owners at all times, as required per the City's Municipal Code and LA County Code (RHEMC §12.24.090 & LACC §10.32.010).

It is in all owners' best interest to leash their dogs to prevent them from approaching other animals that could be fearful, aggressive or in training.
